In 1849, the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi built their Motherhouse on land that was called Nojoshing by the Indians, because it protrudes out into Lake Michigan like a straight tongue.

Sr. Leander Liu Marks 100 Years

hile most people were counting down the days of 2016, Sister Leaner Liu was counting up the years of her life. On December 27, Sister celebrated her 100th birthday. She had her picture taken (see below) with Sister Theodora Bies, who had her 100th birthday in June. As they posed together, Sister Theodora (left) turned to Sister Leander and expressed how pleased she was that Sister had joined her now!

No one was more amazed about being 100 than Sister Leander herself. She remarked how turning 80 had been momentous. And now 100! Her life has been an amazing journey.

Mary Liu was born in Ti-Yang, Shantung, China, to Joseph and



Mary (Wang) Liu, and she had one younger brother. Their father died very young and grandparents lived with them. At age 23, Mary entered the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi in China. A year later she was received as a novice and given the name Sister Leander. Her first profession was in 1944.

our years later, life in China for all of the women who had entered the congregation would come to an end when the Communists took over the government. The Sisters chose to come to the United States rather than go back to their families. They thought this exile would last about four years until it would be possible to return. This didn't happen. Only after diplomatic relations with China were reestablished, many of the Sisters returned for home visits. Sister Leander was able to go back to China for a home visit five times between 1985 and 2000.

Sister ministered in Wisconsin in Superior, Jefferson and Milwaukee. In Taiwan, she ministered in Taipei and Tainan. Her proudest accomplishment in Taiwan was learning to ride a bike. It was a skill that she brought back to the States, and she rode whenever she could.
