Remembering Victims of Human Trafficking

id you know there are an estimated 27.6 million trafficking victims worldwide at any given time? Did you know that human trafficking is found in every region of the **United States?**

The Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi have

a long history of action and education about human trafficking, including partnering with Sisters Program South, Franciscan Peacemakers, and recently the St. Bakhita Catholic Worker House in Milwaukee. Wis.

On January 11, 2023, the Sisters invited the staff at St. Francis Convent to join them in participating in the Department of Homeland Security's "Blue Campaign" initiative, "Wear Blue Day" to raise awareness of human trafficking. Wearing blue served as a reminder to pray throughout

the day for people whose lives are impacted by trafficking.

On February 7, 2023, Sisters honored the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking with a prayer service livestreamed from San Damiano Center to the entire congregation. The

service included personal silent reflection, background about St. Bakhita (patron saint of human trafficking victims), awareness-raising statistics, scripture, words of trafficking survivors, prayer, petitions, and song. Resident Sisters received a St. Josephine Bakhita card and were encouraged to pray the prayer on the back often as an act of spiritual solidarity with all people affected by human trafficking.

any staff, Sisters, and volunteers are involved in supporting and communicating with our donors. Opening and sorting mail, processing check, cash and credit card gifts, printing and mailing acknowledgements, fulfilling donor requests, maintaining accurate donation records, and responding to personal donor requests, are just some of the tasks our caring staff and Sisters perform every day.

Once a donation reaches us, it is entered into a database to accurately keep track of all gifts and donations. From there, thank-you letters are generated and hand stuffed to go in the mail. Any requests for additional cards, enrollments, or other items are put together by hand and mailed as well.
